Benefits of Air Balancing in Residential and Small Commercial HVAC Systems

Air balancing is one of the most valuable services a contractor can perform on both new and existing HVAC systems. Though air balancing has long been utilized in commercial and industrial arenas to help building owners achieve peak system performance, the residential and small commercial sectors are still lagging behind in recognizing its true value.

Since it's not uncommon to find systems that run 30-50% low on airflow, and only about 5% of existing systems operate above 90% of their rated capacity, there is vast opportunity for contractors to provide this highly beneficial service.



HVAC service technicians should get in the habit of checking system airflow on every service call and providing their customers with information on the benefits of a properly balanced system.

Issues commonly uncovered during the testing phase of the process include duct leakage on both the supply and return sides and an inadequately-sized return system. With proper air balancing, customers can expect more consistent temperatures from room to room, cleaner air, better humidity control, improved system performance, and substantial energy savings.

The simplest way to measure system airflow is to test total external static pressure, compare it to manufacturer specifications, then measure CFM at all supply and return grilles and registers. Next, determine how much air is moving through the furnace or air handler and how much is being delivered to and returned from the living space. Based on these readings, technicians can make the appropriate recommendations for corrective measures that can include duct sealing, modifying ductwork and return sizes, repairing ductwork kinks, dampers, and obstructions, correcting insulation issues, cleaning evaporator coils, modifying filtration setup, and

adjusting fan speed. If customers deem certain repairs to be too expensive or disruptive, contractors should provide guidance as to which balancing measures would be most beneficial given the limitations.


